## **Foster Youth and Educational Outcomes**

### **Public Hearing**

SB 158

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop and implement pilot program to assist foster youth transitioning from community colleges to public universities.

SB 159

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish foster youth success centers in each public university.

SB 535

Increases weight allotted for children in poverty, in foster homes and in certain state-recognized facilities for purposes of State School Fund distributions.

SB 811 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Provides tuition and fee remission for natural child of foster parent if natural child attends institution of higher education.

SB 828 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Provides for payment of program expenses of study abroad program for eligible students in foster care.

SB 905

Allows individual voluntarily placed in foster care to be resident of school district where individual resides due to placement by public or private agency if placement agreement provides that individual will no longer be considered resident of school district of origin.
