Work Session

SB 456

Prohibits State Board of Education, school district or public charter school from requiring student to pass test to demonstrate proficiency in Essential Learning Skills in order to receive diploma.

SB 263

Provides that student who legally entered United States under Compact of Free Association treaty between United States and Republic of Palau, Republic of the Marshall Islands or Federated States of Micronesia qualifies for exemption from nonresident tuition and fees at public universities if student meets other tuition equity requirements.

SB 155 *

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary

Requires all investigations involving suspected abuse or sexual conduct by school employees to be conducted by Teacher Standards and Practices Commission.

SB 156 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary

Revises definitions of terms "school employee," "sexual conduct" and "student" for purposes of certain laws related to abuse and sexual conduct by school employees.

SB 960 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes investigatory procedures for reports of suspected sexual conduct.

SB 255 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon Institute of Marine Biology at University of Oregon.

SB 693 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success then to Ways and Means

Extends by five years certain provisions that allow nonresident students to attend public schools as resident students for purposes of State School Fund distributions.

SB 553

Removes sunset on provisions that allow certain nonresident students to attend public schools as resident students for purposes of State School Fund distributions.

SB 905

Allows individual voluntarily placed in foster care to be resident of school district where individual resides due to placement by public or private agency if placement agreement provides that individual will no longer be considered resident of school district of origin.
