SB 337

Requires State Forestry Department, State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation to enter into interagency agreement allowing use of State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation personnel to provide staffing assistance to State Forestry Department during fire season.

SB 338

Provides that members of Oregon Army National Guard and Oregon Air National Guard may receive training in wildland firefighting from public or private entities.

SB 339

Includes land used primarily for cultivating crops within definition of "rangeland" for purposes of organizing rangeland protection association and providing fire protection for rangeland.

SB 694 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Task Force on Rural Fire Protection District Community Development to study and develop recommendations for developing, enhancing or expanding ability of rural fire protection districts to facilitate community development efforts following natural disaster.

Work Session

SB 88

Allows counties to authorize construction of accessory dwelling units on lands zoned for rural residential use.

SB 695

Eliminates cap on amount of debt that ports may incur by promissory note.
