#### **Public Hearing**

SB 301

Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to consider elk overpopulation when implementing the Oregon Landowner Damage Program.

SB 303

Authorizes use of landowner damage tag on adjacent property with consent of owner of adjacent property.

SB 398

Establishes elk depredation hunting tags.

SB 281

Requires manufacturer of digital product to label product with information relating to health risks associated with use of product.

SB 791

Establishes criteria for determining existence or lack of new ground water use impairment or interference with water right having earlier priority date.

SB 893

Expresses state policy to identify certain lands acquired from counties.

#### **Work Session**

SB 337

Requires State Forestry Department, State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation to enter into interagency agreement allowing use of State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation personnel to provide staffing assistance to State Forestry Department during fire season.

SB 339

Includes land used primarily for cultivating crops within definition of "rangeland" for purposes of organizing rangeland protection association and providing fire protection for rangeland.

Establishes Task Force on Rural Fire Protection District Community Development to study and develop recommendations for developing, enhancing or expanding ability of rural fire protection districts to facilitate community development efforts following natural disaster.
