Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2573 A

Requires counties to approve establishment of dwellings in conjunction with farm use on high-value farmland for cranberry farm operator meeting \$40,000 annual income standard.

HB 2841 A

Allows State Department of Fish and Wildlife to refuse disclosure of information relevant to department ability to manage or protect described fish or wildlife species or individual members or populations of species.

HB 2883 A

Prohibits food vendor from using polystyrene container in selling, offering for sale, serving or dispensing prepared food to public.

HB 3365

Changes process for forming or dissolving livestock district, annexing land to livestock district or withdrawing land from livestock district.

Work Session

HB 2109

Requires that, in election proposing annexation, votes from city and territory to be annexed be counted separately to determine separate majorities if territory to be annexed includes 100 acres or more.

HB 2225 A

Defines "center of the subject tract" for siting certain permissible forest dwellings.

HB 2623

Prohibits use of hydraulic fracturing for oil and gas exploration and production.

HB 2834 A

Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife, in cooperation with Department of Transportation, to develop Wildlife Corridor Action Plan for use by state agencies.

HB 3035 A

Increases maximum penalty for certain wildlife law offenses committed without culpable mental state to \$2,000 fine.

HB 3272 A

Limits extension that Land Use Board of Appeals may provide petitioner whose objection to record is denied to 14 days from later of original deadline or date of denial.
