Prescribes requirements for Oregon Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Services Program.

SB 599

Establishes Medical Marijuana Patient Access Committee to study and recommend methods to reduce barriers to accessing medical marijuana and to advise Oregon Health Authority on issues related to accessing medical marijuana.

Requires memory care facilities and assisted living facilities to provide written notice to applicants for admission and to current residents at specified times regarding services, rates, staffing and eligibility or of changes to services, rates, staffing or eligibility.

Makes period of absence for donation of body part, organ or tissue "serious health condition" for which family leave may be taken.

SB 526

Directs Oregon Health Authority to study home visiting by licensed health care providers.

SB 911 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Pagying health hanefit plans state medical assistance program. Public Employees! Penefit Penefi

Requires health benefit plans, state medical assistance program, Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to pay for standard fertility preservation services for covered individual who will undergo medical treatment that is likely to result in iatrogenic infertility.

SB 142

Changes "venereal disease" and "sexually transmitted disease" to "sexually transmitted infection." Changes "human immunodeficiency virus" and "acquired immune deficiency syndrome" to "blood-borne pathogen.".

AGENDA (Cont.) March 18, 2019

SB 834

Provides that expression of regret or apology made by or on behalf of person licensed by Oregon Board of Dentistry does not constitute admission of liability in civil action and that person who makes expression may not be examined with respect to expression.

SB 835

Allows dentist to advertise practice in specialty area of dentistry.
