SB 889

SB 131 **

Requires Director of Oregon Health Authority to appoint Children's Health Advocate to investigate complaints and take steps to ensure access to and reimbursement of timely health care for children placed by Department of Human Services in private child-caring agencies.

SB 452

Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop triage, treatment and transportation protocols for patients who carry emergency use medications.

SB 796

Makes period of absence for donation of body part, organ or tissue "serious health condition" for which family leave may be taken.

SB 824

Requires Oregon Board of Dentistry to accept examination results of applicant's fitness to practice dentistry from board-recognized testing agencies.

SB 795

Prescribes requirements for Oregon Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Services Program.
