#### Public Hearing

- SB 490  
Adds individuals who have operated child care facility in violation of child care facility or Central Background Registry law to list of individuals who are prohibited from providing child care for five years.
- SB 804 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary then to Ways and Means  
Modifies child abuse reporting requirements to require Department of Human Services to notify law enforcement agency within county where alleged child abuse occurred.
- SB 813  
Directs Office of Child Care to make reasonable attempt to identify any facility about which it receives complaint if certain information is provided.
- SB 833 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs Department of Human Services to require criminal records checks on noninvolved parents prior to releasing child in protective custody to custody of noninvolved parent.

#### Work Session

- SB 176 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Environment and Natural Resources  
Requires certain filling stations, service stations, garages and other dispensaries that dispense Class 1 flammable liquids to provide equal access to persons with disabilities.
- SB 31 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary  
Permits Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator to establish county, regional and statewide high-risk teams to determine options available for addressing safety risks facing highly vulnerable adults.
- SB 177 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Health Care  
Requires hospice program licensed by Oregon Health Authority to identify patients in need of palliative care, provide information to patients, residents and families of patients about palliative care and facilitate patient access to palliative care.
- SB 178 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Health Care  
Permits health care representative to make election for hospice treatment on behalf of incapacitated principal with terminal condition who does not have valid advance directive.

- SB 179 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Health Care  
Requires Department of Human Services to administer palliative care pilot project to support provision of community-based end of life care.
- SB 491  
Transfers from Department of Human Services to Oregon Community Foundation responsibility for administering Fairview housing trust.
- SB 492  
Proclaims state policy to provide aids, benefits and services to persons with disabilities who are parents or guardians.
- HB 2215  
Adds to rights of persons with mental illness committed to Oregon Health Authority, right to reasonable privacy and security in resting, sleeping, dressing, bathing, personal hygiene and toileting.
- SB 181  
Modifies definition of "child-caring agency" to include county programs that provide care or services to children in custody of Department of Human Services or Oregon Youth Authority.
- SB 415 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Education  
Adds school district board members and public charter school governing body members to list of mandatory reporters of child abuse.
- SB 737 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures  
Extends sunset for property tax exemption for low income rental housing.
- SB 163  
Provides that Oregon 529 Savings Board may collect certain fees to defray costs of ABLE program.
- SB 278  
Extends eligibility for Rent Guarantee Program to individuals between 17 and 20 years of age who were wards within past six years.
- SB 727 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Requires Department of Human Services to adopt by rule program that provides financial assistance to recipients of supplemental nutrition assistance for purchasing locally grown fruits and vegetables from participating farmers' markets, farm share sites and retail outlets.
