SB 814 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Human Services to provide notice to parents or legal guardians regarding voluntary adoption options, including options for post-adoption contact agreements, prior to termination of parental rights.

SB 917 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Prohibits long term care facilities, residential facilities, adult foster homes, child care facilities, child-caring agencies, foster homes, youth care centers, youth offender foster homes or other entities that are licensed, certified or registered to provide care to children, youth, individuals with disabilities or older adults from interfering with disclosure of information by prospective employees, employees or volunteers about treatment of individuals cared for by entity to regulatory agencies, law enforcement authorities or persons acting on behalf of individual.

SB 491

Transfers from Department of Human Services to Oregon Community Foundation responsibility for administering Fairview housing trust.

SB 727 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Department of Human Services to adopt by rule program that provides financial assistance to recipients of supplemental nutrition assistance for purchasing locally grown fruits and vegetables from participating farmers' markets, farm share sites and retail outlets.

SB 804 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary then to Ways and Means Modifies child abuse reporting requirements to require Department of Human Services to notify law enforcement agency within county where alleged child abuse occurred.

HB 2215

Adds to rights of persons with mental illness committed to Oregon Health Authority, right to reasonable privacy and security in resting, sleeping, dressing, bathing, personal hygiene and toileting.

SB 178

Permits health care representative to make election for hospice treatment on behalf of incapacitated principal with terminal condition who does not have valid advance directive.
