#### **Public Hearing**

SB 669

Modifies requirements for licensing of in-home care agencies.

SB 816 \*\*

Directs Department of Human Services to conduct study that identifies ways to improve foster care system in Oregon and present report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services on or before September 15, 2020.

SB 653

Prohibits Department of Human Services from disclosing records and reports related to child abuse investigations to certain entities unless court finds report of abuse is founded.

SB 22

Requires Oregon Health Authority to establish standards for identifying behavioral health homes.

Directs Department of Human Services to conduct annual in-person case planning with ward 14 years of age or older during which department informs ward that ward is eligible for transition services and provides ward with assistance in applying for transition services, if applicable. 707 \*\*

Establishes Youth Suicide Intervention and Prevention Advisory Committee.

#### SB 917 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Prohibits long term care facilities, residential facilities, adult foster homes, child care facilities, child-caring agencies, foster homes, youth care centers, youth offender foster homes or other entities that are licensed, certified or registered to provide care to children, youth, individuals with disabilities or older adults from interfering with disclosure of information by prospective employees, employees or volunteers about treatment of individuals cared for by entity to regulatory agencies, law enforcement authorities or persons acting on behalf of individual.
