SB 669

Modifies requirements for licensing of in-home care agencies.

SB 816 \*\*

Directs Department of Human Services to conduct study that identifies ways to improve foster care system in Oregon and present report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services on or before September 15, 2020.

SB 653

Prohibits Department of Human Services from disclosing records and reports related to child abuse investigations to certain entities unless court finds report of abuse is founded.

#### SB 994

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Directs Department of Human Services to study and make recommendations on provisions of state law relating to juveniles.

#### Work Session

SB 490

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Adds individuals who have operated child care facility in violation of child care facility or Central Background Registry law to list of individuals who are prohibited from providing child care for five years.

SB 19

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Requires Department of Human Services and Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules for licensing of each type of adult foster home, including those providing residential care to older adults, persons with physical disabilities, persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with mental illness.

SB 20

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Consolidates eligibility for services to children and adults with developmental disabilities.

SB 274

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Expands eligibility for support service brokerage services to individuals who are 14 to 17 years of age.

SB 475

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Directs Department of Human Services to conduct monthly, in-person visits with child or ward in substitute care that include updates on academic status and progress.

SB 491

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Transfers from Department of Human Services to Oregon Community Foundation responsibility for administering Fairview housing trust.

SB 813

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Directs Office of Child Care to make reasonable attempt to identify any facility about which it receives complaint if certain information is provided. 964 \*\* \*\* Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures

SB 964 \*\*

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/21/2019 AGENDA: Directs Department of Human Services to establish pilot program to encourage innovative strategies to strengthen families and build resilient neighborhoods. 745 \*\* \*\* Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

SB 745 \*\*

Directs Department of Human Services to conduct annual in-person case planning with ward 14 years of age or older during which department informs ward that ward is eligible for transition services and provides ward with assistance in applying for transition services, if applicable.

SB 707 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Youth Suicide Intervention and Prevention Advisory Committee.

SB 917 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Prohibits long term care facilities, residential facilities, adult foster homes, child care facilities, child-caring agencies, foster homes, youth care centers, youth offender foster homes or other entities that are licensed, certified or registered to provide care to children, youth, individuals with disabilities or older adults from interfering with disclosure of information by prospective employees, employees or volunteers about treatment of individuals cared for by entity to regulatory agencies, law enforcement authorities or persons acting on behalf of individual.
