SB 825 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to study and make recommendations on provisions of state law relating to placement of children in child-caring agencies.

Work Session

SB 832 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Declares purpose of Critical Incident Review Teams.

SB 1 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Statewide System of Care Task Force.

SB 221
Directs Department of Human Services to conduct study about children and youth with specialized needs and to report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services on or before September 15, 2020.

SB 475
Directs Department of Human Services to conduct monthly, in-person visits with child or ward in substitute care that include updates on academic status and progress.

SB 669
Modifies requirements for licensing of in-home care agencies.

SB 707 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Youth Suicide Intervention and Prevention Advisory Committee.

- SB 964 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures
Directs Department of Human Services to establish pilot program to encourage innovative strategies to strengthen families and build resilient neighborhoods.
- SB 490
Adds individuals who have operated child care facility in violation of child care facility or Central Background Registry law to list of individuals who are prohibited from providing child care for five years.
- SB 745 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to conduct annual in-person case planning with ward 14 years of age or older during which department informs ward that ward is eligible for transition services and provides ward with assistance in applying for transition services, if applicable.
- SB 917 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Prohibits long term care facilities, residential facilities, adult foster homes, child care facilities, child-caring agencies, foster homes, youth care centers, youth offender foster homes or other entities that are licensed, certified or registered to provide care to children, youth, individuals with disabilities or older adults from interfering with disclosure of information by prospective employees, employees or volunteers about treatment of individuals cared for by entity to regulatory agencies, law enforcement authorities or persons acting on behalf of individual.
