Public Hearing and Work Session

- SB 299
Prohibits denial of medical assistance on basis that individual under 18 years of age is in detention pending adjudication.
- SB 596
Provides that if person reports commission of person felony to emergency communications system or law enforcement agency, evidence of prostitution obtained as result of making report may not be used against person in prosecution for prostitution or attempted prostitution.
- SB 962 **
Directs certifying agencies to certify to United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, within specified time, victim helpfulness in detecting, investigating or prosecuting qualifying criminal activity. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 1011
Provides that obligee spouse's conviction for attempted murder or conspiracy to commit murder of obligor spouse is change of circumstances for purposes of spousal support modification.

Work Session

- SB 111
Provides that wine meeting certain criteria is deceptively labeled or branded.
- SB 356
Permits detailed parenting plan to include instructions regarding notification requirements for specified matters.
- SB 371
Establishes pilot programs for purpose of appointing legal counsel for children in contested domestic relations proceedings.
- SB 385 **
Directs presiding judge of each judicial district to establish alternative dispute resolution conference procedure for custody and parenting time modifications and enforcement proceedings. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 378
Requires that court-ordered fitness to proceed examination and filing of examination report occur within 14 days of examination order if defendant is in custody.

- SB 498
Requires Department of Corrections to adopt rules that prohibit correctional facilities, and requires cities and counties to adopt ordinances that prohibit local correctional facilities, from having contract with provider of telephone services under which department, city, county or facility receives payment for telephone services provided to inmates of facility.
- SB 591
Makes violation of statutes or rules regarding minimum standards for wine, or branding or labeling requirements for wine, unlawful trade practice.
