SB 681 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Human Services

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/2019 AGENDA: Prescribes optional form for supported decision-making agreement.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Human Services

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/2019 AGENDA: Specifies charges or convictions that may not be considered in fitness determinations.

SB 962 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/2019 AGENDA: Directs certifying agencies to certify to United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, within specified time, victim helpfulness in detecting, investigating or prosecuting qualifying criminal activity.

SB 369

Modifies statute of limitation for action against architect, landscape architect or engineer arising out of construction, alteration or repair of improvement to real property.

SB 420

Directs Department of Justice to identify misdemeanor convictions for possession, delivery or manufacture of marijuana based on conduct that would not constitute crime under current law.

SB 579

Creates exception under Death with Dignity Act to 15-day waiting period for patient with less than 15 days to live.

SB 912 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Revises definition of terms "sexual conduct" and "substantiated report" for purposes of certain laws related to abuse and sexual conduct by school employees.

SB 1005

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to conduct study on relationship between recidivism rates and sentence imposed and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.
