SB 984

SB 999

Deletes obsolete reference to definition of "alternative fuel vehicle." Defines "alternative fuel vehicle.".

SB 1000

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to conduct study on pretrial release and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.

SB 1001

Directs State Court Administrator to study issues relating to court records and report to committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2020.

SB 1004

Directs Department of Justice to conduct study on prosecution of domestic violence offenses and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.

SB 1005

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to conduct study on relationship between recidivism rates and sentence imposed and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.

SB 1006

Directs State Court Administrator to study issues relating to juries and report to committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2020.

Work Session

SB 111

Provides that wine meeting certain criteria is deceptively labeled or branded.

SB 369

Modifies statute of limitation for action against architect, landscape architect or engineer arising out of construction, alteration or repair of improvement to real property.

SB 420

Directs Department of Justice to identify misdemeanor convictions for possession, delivery or manufacture of marijuana based on conduct that would not constitute crime under current law.

SB 482

Provides that sexual assault restraining order is of indefinite duration and continues until order is terminated by court.

SB 579

Creates exception under Death with Dignity Act to 15-day waiting period for patient with less than 15 days to live.

SB 591

Makes violation of statutes or rules regarding minimum standards for wine, or branding or labeling requirements for wine, unlawful trade practice.

SB 703

Prohibits commercial sale of health information by covered entity, business associate, subcontractor, as defined by Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, or other third party, without authorization of individual whose health information would be included in sale.

SB 723

Prohibits person from organizing, sponsoring, promoting, conducting or participating in contest, competition, tournament or derby that has objective of taking wildlife for prizes or other inducement or for entertainment.

SB 725 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Human Services Specifies charges or convictions that may not be considered in fitness determinations.

SB 762

Extends date by which commitment hearing must be held.

SB 810

Modifies definition of "vulnerable user of a public way" to include persons operating or riding on moped or motorcycle.

SB 912 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Revises definition of terms "sexual conduct" and "substantiated report" for purposes of certain laws related to abuse and sexual conduct by school employees.

SB 924 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Modifies juvenile code to prohibit placement of children and wards taken into protective custody in detention facilities.

SB 966

Provides that person in custody of Oregon Youth Authority for offense committed while person was under 18 years of age, for which person was sentenced to term of imprisonment with projected release date that falls after person attains 25 years of age but before person attains 27 years of age, is eligible for conditional release hearing.

AGENDA (Cont.) April 8, 2019

- SB 967
 - Requires court to include in judgment document age of defendant at time of committing offense if defendant sentenced to term of incarceration and physical custody of defendant is related to age of defendant at time of committing crime.
- SB 968
 - Prohibits person who was under 18 years of age at time of committing offense from being sentenced to life imprisonment without possibility of release or parole.
- SB 969
 - Eliminates mandatory adult prosecution for certain offenses committed when person charged is 15, 16 or 17 years of age at time of offense.
- SB 1008
 - Authorizes juvenile offender charged with offense subject to mandatory minimum sentence, who receives mandatory minimum sentence or other sentence of imprisonment, to be eligible for conditional release after serving at least one-half of sentence imposed.
- SB 1013
 - Removes future dangerousness as factor for jury to determine when deciding on sentence of death.
