Public Hearing and Work Session

HB 2400

Extends deadline to appeal mental illness determination under certain circumstances.

HB 2042

Removes sunset date on temporary law and makes permanent law authorizing Oregon Youth Authority and county juvenile departments to disclose and provide copies of reports and other materials relating to child, ward, youth or youth offender's history and prognosis to Department of Corrections for specified purposes.

HB 2321 A

Exempts from required disclosure pursuant to public records request, home address, home phone number and other specified personal information of county juvenile department employees who primarily perform duties related to youth offenders confined in detention facilities.

HB 2397 A

Removes provision under which certain actions of person in soliciting participation in contest or sweepstakes are unlawful practice only if solicitation occurs through use of United States mail.

HB 2398 A

Specifies that compensation paid to employees of charitable gaming events is based on Oregon minimum wage standards.
