HB 2051 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-17-2019 AGENDA: Conditionally exempts from disclosure, pursuant to public records request, contents of reports made through Department of State Police statewide tip line unless public interest requires disclosure in particular instance.

HB 2286

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-17-2019 AGENDA: Places civil forfeiture proceeds used to fund scholarship for children of deceased or disabled public safety officers in account established or designated by State Treasurer in Oregon 529 Savings Network, rather than in Oregon 529 College Savings Plan Subaccount.

HB 2466 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-17-2019 AGENDA: Requires certain homeowners associations and all condominium unit owners associations to carry fidelity bond coverage, unless owners and board have elected otherwise in the preceding year.

HB 2485 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-17-2019 AGENDA: Establishes procedures for adoption of restated declaration, restated assignment of use of limited common elements and restated bylaws by condominium association.

HB 2079

Modifies and adds laws related to boating offenses.

HB 2471 A

Provides that, in prosecutions for violation of city motor vehicle parking ordinances, defendant may not be required to pay fine or bail amount before requesting hearing or submitting explanation to court.
