Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2876 A
Requires each school district to provide coordinated comprehensive school counseling program.
- HB 3173
Specifies that when two or more county commissioners are elected for one county at same election and one is elected to fill vacancy, commissioner filling vacancy shall hold office for two years.
- HCR 27
Commends Portland Thorns Football Club for its achievements.
- SB 113 A
Authorizes court to award prevailing retail customers, who bring actions against vehicle dealers relating to vehicle registration or vehicle titling, attorney fees under certain circumstances.
- SB 361 A
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5-20-2019 AGENDA: Modifies prudent investor rule to allow trustee to consider settlor's or beneficiaries' personal values, including settlor's or beneficiaries' desire to engage in sustainable or socially responsible investment strategies aligning with settlor's or beneficiaries' social, environmental, governance or other values or beliefs, and beneficiaries' financial needs, when making investment decisions.
- SB 905
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5-20-2019 AGENDA: Allows individual voluntarily placed in foster care to be resident of school district where individual resides due to placement by public or private agency if placement agreement provides that individual will no longer be considered resident of school district of origin.
- SB 1025
Limits actions of persons that take clams for commercial purposes.

- SB 455
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5-20-2019 AGENDA: Requires public universities, community colleges and community college districts to require contractors to employ apprentices and to establish and execute plan for outreach, recruitment and retention of women and minority individuals for certain work relating to improvements to real property.
