Mr. Chair, members of the committee:

My name is Kay Brown and I am a member of the Restoration and Enhancement Board. The Board consists of 7 members, 3 representing the anglers, 3 representing commercial fishing interests and a member at large. These dedicated individuals follow a long line of public volunteer Board members who are responsible for recommending to the Fish and Wildlife Commission how the money from the surcharge is spent.

The Restoration and Enhancement Board was created in 1989 and has carried a sunset clause ever since. The original bill was created out of a frustration by members of the public over how the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife spent license dollars. We believe over time the Board has proven itself effective in establishing priorities for the use of the surcharges on licenses and poundage fees. We would like to see the sunset clause removed and allow this program to move forward as a permanent part of the ODFW statutes.

One challenge has been the appointment of Board members representing the commercial fishing industry. Section 2 of the bill amends the appointment to 3 member of the commercial salmon industry, without specifying which sector of the salmon industry the representative is aligned with. We believe this will give the Commission greater latitude in recruiting members to the Board and support the change.

The Board is proud of the results from the projects that we fund. In particular, we often partner with other funding sources. In the last biennium every R&E dollar awarded leveraged \$4.60 in other contributions. In the 10 years preceding last biennium, the boards leveraged \$2.35 for every dollar awarded. This has allowed us to fund many priority projects that otherwise would not have been possible with the funds available. We would like to see this record of success continue into the future.

The Board supports Senate Bill 42 and encourages this committee to vote in favor of the bill.
