



#### Ready for What?





- 4+ haven't gone away, but focus is on China and Russia as "near peers"
- China used to "fear us and respect us"...now they only "respect" us
- China Belt Road Initiative is seeing challenges, may have internal/external impacts
- Short term Russian military threat presents risks
- Vulnerability of Homeland to kinetic events is growing
- Growing threat areas: cyber and UAS



#### 2018 Successes

- Oregon HB 4035 100% Tuition Assistance
