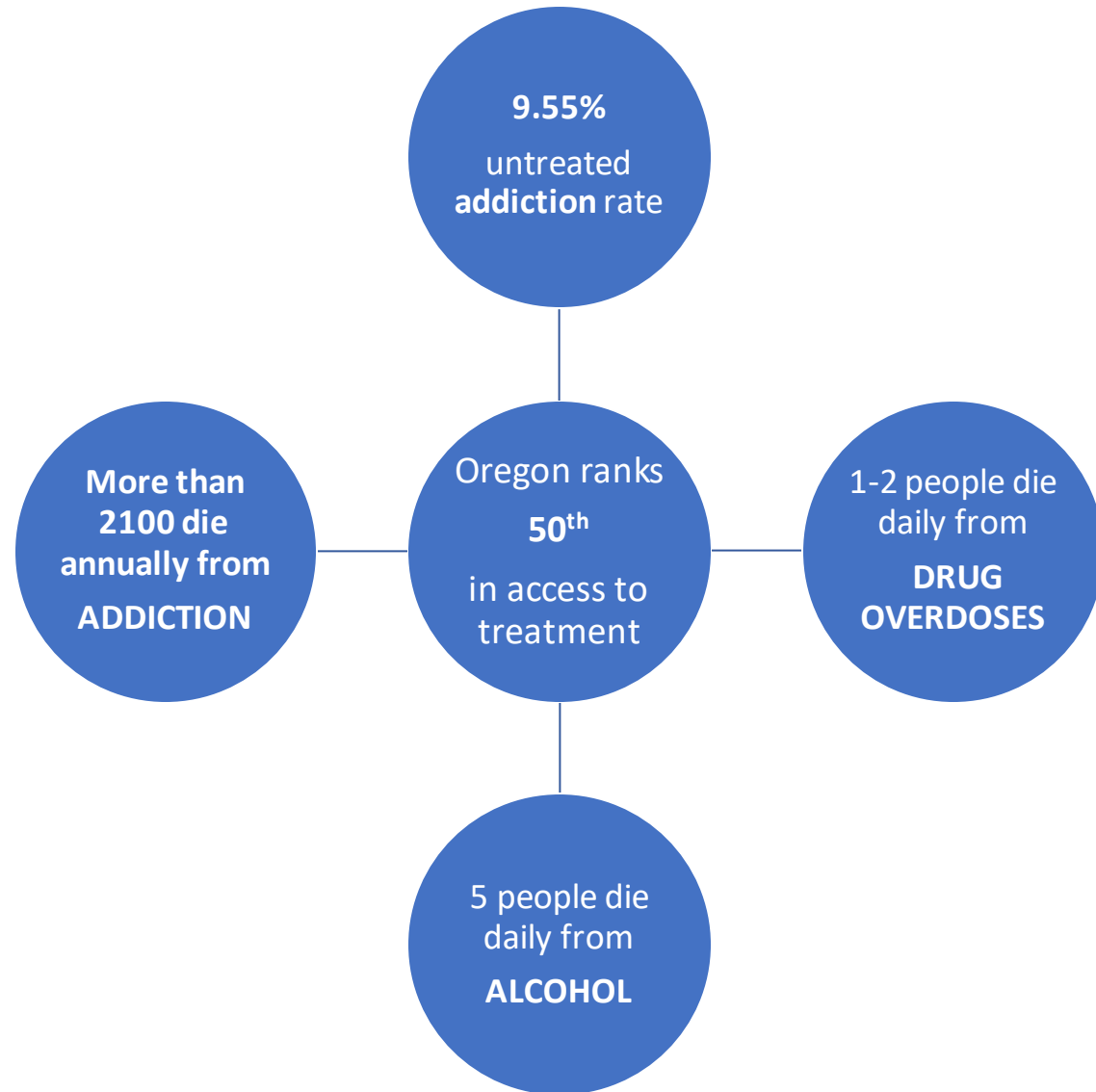

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Why?

- ✓ No single point of accountability/authority
 - ✓ State Alcohol & Drug Policy Commission (ADPC)
- ✓ No comprehensive, statewide strategic plan
- ✓ No one with lived experience in decision making roles at state level
- ✓ Addiction treated as an acute problem and not a chronic disease
- ✓ Lack of political commitment



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OREGON RECOVERS 3-YEAR STRATEGY

- ✓ Mobilize the Recovery Community
- ✓ Secure commitment from Governor
- ✓ Secure new leadership in decision making roles
- ✓ Establish & launch strategic planning process



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Success to Date

- ✓ September 2017 Recovery Rally
- ✓ Rep. Sanchez strategic planning legislation
- ✓ Addiction recovery policy transferred from Public Safety to Public Health advisor
- ✓ Governor: Declaration of Public Health Crisis
- ✓ OHA Reorganization
- ✓ New Alcohol & Drug Policy Director
- ✓ Framework for a Strategic Plan



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5-year Historic Goals Adopted

- ✓ Lowering addiction rate from 4th highest to 10th lowest
 - ✓ From 9.55% to 6.82%
- ✓ Establishing a “state recovery” rate for the first time and working to increase it by 25%

RECOMMENDED STRATEGIC PLAN OBJECTIVES

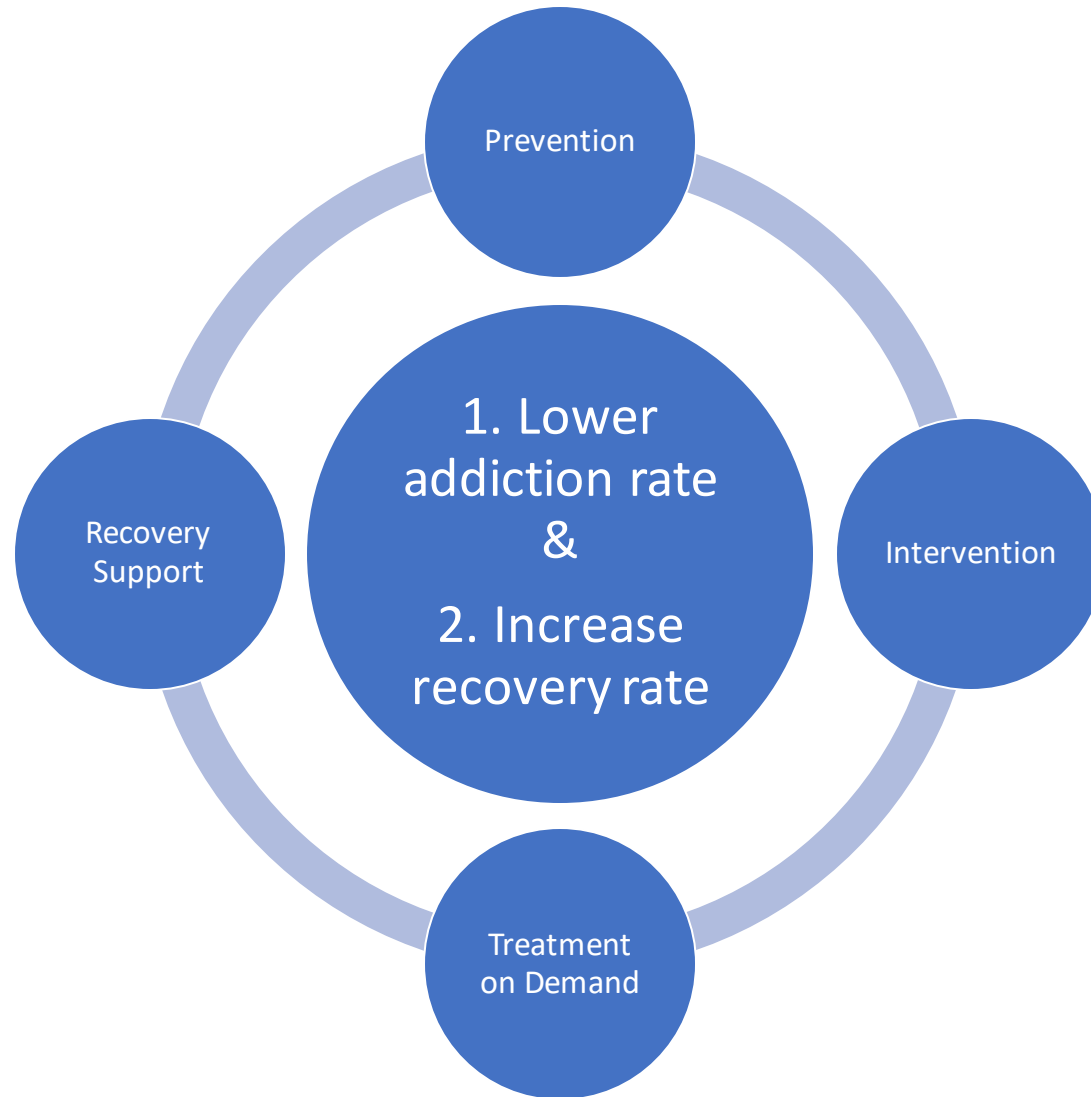
The two primary objectives of the ADPC addiction recovery strategic plan should be to:

1. Reduce Oregon’s addiction/SUD rate from 9.55%¹ to 6.82%² in five (5) years. This would prevent addiction and/or promote recovery in approximately 75,000 people.
2. Increase the current Oregon recovery rate (yet to be determined) by 25% in five years.³
