My name is Claire Hall and I am Chair of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners. Lincoln County has invested in and benefited from Venture Catalyst support from one of the organizations identified in SB 258. I am writing today to ask you to support SB 258.

Lincoln County and other cities and counties in this region have been funding the Venture Catalyst initiative. We have seen real results in our community and region from this initiative, including an increase in: the number of start-ups, the number of living-wage jobs, the amount of revenue generated by these start-ups, and the amount of capital invested in these start-ups.
