SUMMARY

Specifies that podiatry includes diagnosis and treatment of ailments of soft tissue distal to tibial tubercle.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to podiatry; amending ORS 677.010.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 677.010 is amended to read:
- 5 677.010. As used in this chapter, subject to the exemptions in ORS 677.060
- 6 and unless the context requires otherwise:
- 7 (1) "Approved internship" means the first year of post-graduate training
- 8 served in a hospital that is approved by the board or by the Accreditation
- 9 Council of Graduate Medical Education, the American Osteopathic Associ-
- 10 ation or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.
- 11 (2) "Approved school of medicine" means a school offering a full-time
- 12 resident program of study in medicine or osteopathic medicine leading to a
- 13 degree of Doctor of Medicine or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, such pro-
- 14 gram having been fully accredited or conditionally approved by the Liaison
- 15 Committee on Medical Education, or its successor agency, or the American
- 16 Osteopathic Association, or its successor agency, or having been otherwise
- 17 determined by the board to meet the association standards as specifically
- 18 incorporated into board rules.
- 19 (3) "Board" means the Oregon Medical Board.
- 20 (4) "Diagnose" means to examine another person in any manner to deter-
- 21 mine the source or nature of a disease or other physical or mental condition,

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- 1 or to hold oneself out or represent that a person is so examining another
- 2 person. It is not necessary that the examination be made in the presence of
- 3 such other person; it may be made on information supplied either directly
- 4 or indirectly by such other person.
- 5 (5) "Dispense" means the preparation and delivery of a prescription drug,
- 6 pursuant to a lawful order of a practitioner, in a suitable container appro-
- 7 priately labeled for subsequent administration to or use by a patient or other
- 8 individual entitled to receive the prescription drug.
- 9 (6) "Dispensing physician" means a physician or podiatric physician and
- 10 surgeon who purchases prescription drugs for the purpose of dispensing them
- 11 to patients or other individuals entitled to receive the prescription drug and
- 12 who dispenses them accordingly.
- 13 (7) "Drug" means all medicines and preparations for internal or external
- 14 use of humans, intended to be used for the cure, mitigation or prevention of
- 15 diseases or abnormalities of humans, which are recognized in any published
- 16 United States Pharmacopoeia or National Formulary, or otherwise estab-
- 17 lished as a drug.
- 18 (8) "Fellow" means an individual who has not qualified under ORS 677.100
- 19 (1) and (2) and who is pursuing some special line of study as part of a
- 20 supervised program of a school of medicine, a hospital approved for
- 21 internship or residency training, or an institution for medical research or
- 22 education that provides for a period of study under the supervision of a re-
- 23 sponsible member of that hospital or institution, such school, hospital or
- 24 institution having been approved by the board.
- 25 (9) "Intern" means an individual who has entered into a hospital or hos-
- 26 pitals for the first year of post-graduate training.
- 27 (10) "License" means permission to practice, whether by license, regis-
- 28 tration or certification.
- 29 (11) "Licensee" means an individual holding a valid license issued by the
- 30 board.
- 31 (12) "Physical incapacity" means a condition that renders an individual

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- 1 licensed under this chapter unable to practice under that license with pro-
- 2 fessional skill and safety by reason of physical illness or physical deteri-
- 3 oration that adversely affects cognition, motor or perceptive skill.
- 4 (13) "Physician" means a person who holds a degree of Doctor of Medicine
- 5 or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, or a person who holds a degree of Doctor
- 6 of Podiatric Medicine if the context in which the term "physician" is used
- 7 does not authorize or require the person to practice outside the scope of a
- 8 license issued under ORS 677.805 to 677.840.
- 9 (14) "Podiatric physician and surgeon" means a physician licensed under
- 10 ORS 677.805 to 677.840 to treat ailments of the human foot, ankle and
- 11 tendons directly attached to and governing the function of the foot and an-
- 12 kle.
- 13 (15)(a) "Podiatry" means:
- 14 (A) The diagnosis or the medical, physical or surgical treatment of
- 15 ailments of the human foot, ankle and tendons directly attached to and
- 16 governing the function of the foot and ankle, including soft tissue distal
- 17 to the tibial tubercle, except treatment involving the use of a general or
- 18 spinal anesthetic unless the treatment is performed in a hospital licensed
- 19 under ORS 441.025 or in an ambulatory surgical center licensed by the
- 20 Oregon Health Authority and is under the supervision of or in collaboration
- 21 with a podiatric physician and surgeon; and
- 22 (B) Assisting in the performance of surgery, as provided in ORS 677.814.
- 23 (b) "Podiatry" does not include administering general or spinal anesthet-
- 24 ics or the amputation of the entire foot.
- 25 (16) "Prescribe" means to direct, order or designate the use of or manner
- 26 of using by spoken or written words or other means.
- 27 (17) "Resident" means an individual who, after the first year of post-
- 28 graduate training, in order to qualify for some particular specialty in the
- 29 field of medicine, pursues a special line of study as part of a supervised
- 30 program of a hospital approved by the board.

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
