This kind of quantification and standardization is not only counterproductive but the never-ending taking of tests gradually erodes true learning as well as creativity.

To be sure, testing has its place but with a much less intrusive and pervasive presence as it has now. Especially with our earliest grade school children, we need to give them every chance to find the joy and 05wonder of learning which will hopefully carry them throughout their school years and indeed throughout their lives. Please, give these children a chance to learn such enjoyment before subjecting them to pressures, not to mention the ubiquity, of taking tests.
