LC 1200 2019 Regular Session 1/31/19 (CDT/ps)

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SUMMARY

Requires Construction Contractors Board to establish endorsement program for construction contractors and employees engaging in work on water-based fire suppression system. Requires contractor or employee to hold appropriate type of endorsement prior to contractor performing work on water-based fire suppression system.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to water-based fire suppression systems.

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3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Sections 2 and 3 of this 2019 Act are added to and made 5 a part of ORS chapter 701.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) As used in this chapter, "fire sprinkler system 7 work" means design, installation, testing and maintenance of a 8 water-based fire suppression system.

9 (2) A contractor may not perform work on a water-based fire sup-10 pression system unless the Construction Contractors Board has issued 11 the contractor or a full-time employee of the contractor a fire sprin-12 kler system professional endorsement under this section that is ap-13 propriate for the work.

(3) The board shall establish a program for the certification of
 qualified individuals as fire sprinkler system professionals. The board
 shall establish:

(a) An endorsement authorizing fire sprinkler system work on one and two-family dwellings and on any underground mains dedicated for
 supplying water-based fire suppression systems in one- and two-family

1 dwellings.

(b) An endorsement authorizing fire sprinkler system work on oneand two-family dwellings and on multifamily residential structures
four stories or less above grade.

5 (c) An endorsement authorizing fire sprinkler system work on a 6 structure of any type, and on any underground mains dedicated for 7 supplying the water-based fire suppression system in a structure of 8 any type.

9 (d) An endorsement authorizing the installation of underground
10 mains dedicated for supplying the water-based fire suppression system
11 in a structure of any type.

12 (e) An endorsement authorizing the inspection and testing of 13 water-based fire suppression systems.

(4) A residential contractor or commercial contractor may perform
fire sprinkler system work described in subsection (3)(a) or (b) of this
section if the contractor or at least one full-time employee of the
contractor holds an appropriate endorsement under subsection (3)(a)
or (b) of this section. A residential contractor or a full-time employee
of a residential contractor may not perform fire sprinkler system work
described in subsection (3)(c) to (e) of this section.

21(5) A commercial contractor may perform fire sprinkler system work described in subsection (3)(a) to (c) of this section if the con-22tractor or at least full-time employee of the contractor holds an ap-23propriate endorsement under subsection (3)(c) of this section. A 24commercial contractor may perform fire sprinkler system work de-25scribed in subsection (3)(d) of this section if the contractor or at least 26one full-time employee of the contractor holds an appropriate 27endorsement under subsection (3)(c) or (d) of this section. A commer-28cial contractor may perform fire sprinkler system work described in 29subsection (3)(e) of this section if each individual who physically per-30 forms the work holds an endorsement under section (3)(e) of this sec-31

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2 (6) A contractor may not subcontract work requiring an endorse3 ment under this section unless the subcontractor holds appropriate
4 endorsement under this section for the work.

5 (7) An applicant for endorsement as a fire sprinkler system profes-6 sional shall:

7 (a) Submit an application in a form acceptable to the board and
8 containing information required by the board;

9 (b) Pass an examination approved by the board; and

(c) Provide evidence of any education, training or experience re quired by the board.

(8) The board may establish reasonable fees for applications and the
 issuance or renewal of endorsements under this section.

(9) The board shall, for purposes of administering and enforcing the
 endorsement program, give consideration to any relevant standards
 of national organizations for fire protection or engineering technolo gies.

(10) An endorsement as a fire sprinkler system professional is a
 personal privilege that is nontransferrable.

(11) An individual who is acting within the scope of an endorsement
issued under this section is not required to be licensed under ORS
447.010 to 447.156, 671.010 to 671.220 or 672.002 to 672.325 or ORS chapter
693 to design a water-based fire suppression system.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) An individual may not be considered, for purposes of section 2 of this 2019 Act, to be the full-time employee of more than one construction contractor at the same time. If an individual holding an endorsement as a fire sprinkler professional ceases to be a full-time employee of a construction contractor, the individual shall notify the Construction Contractors Board of the change no later than 30 days after ceasing to be a full-time employee of the contractor.

31 (2) If an individual holding an endorsement as a fire sprinkler pro-

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fessional ceases to be a full-time employee of a construction contractor, the construction contractor shall send notice to the board no later than 180 days after the individual holding the endorsement ceases to be a full-time employee of the contractor. A notice that the contractor send to the board under this section must:

(a) Verify that the contractor or at least one full-time employee of
the contractor holds an endorsement as a fire sprinkler professional
appropriate for the fire sprinkler work engaged in by the contractor;
or

10 (b) Verify that the contractor is not actively engaged in fire sprin-11 kler system work and will not undertake fire sprinkler system work 12 unless the contractor or a full-time employee holds an appropriate 13 endorsement for the work.

(3) The board may adopt rules regarding the form, content and de livery method for notices required under this section.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The Construction Contractors Board shall make fire
 sprinkler system professional endorsements available for issuance un der section 2 of this 2019 Act no later than January 1, 2021.

(2) The board may not assert a violation of section 2 of this 2019
 Act for fire sprinkler system work that a construction contractor
 commences prior to January 1, 2022.

22 (3) Section 3 of this 2019 Act becomes operative January 1, 2021.

(4) Notwithstanding sections 2 and 3 of this 2019 Act, the board may 23issue a contractor a temporary authorization to perform fire sprinkler 24system work without holding an endorsement under section 1 of this 252019 Act if the contractor is performing fire sprinkler system work on 26the effective date of this 2019 Act and the board determines that the 27contractor has the competency to properly perform the work. A tem-28porary authorization must specify the classes of fire sprinkler system 29 work that are within the scope of the temporary authorization. A 30 temporary authorization under this subsection shall expire three years 31

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after issuance and may not be renewed. A determination of competency under this subsection applies only to the temporary authorization and does not establish competency for purposes of any subsequent application for endorsement under section 2 of this 2019 Act.

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
