Chair Dembrow and members of the committee,

I'm Clair Klock from Corbett, OR. I'm sorry not to address you in person, however as I get older, my desire to pull myself out of a ditch or chain up on snowy or icy winter days becomes less and less.

I have concerns that SB 2 will be an open opportunity to expand industry area onto good prime range and crop land. I would limit the 50 acre expansion to areas contiguous to the UGB that doesn't interfere with Agr or range land.

I understand the need for working wages in rural areas to help alleviate pressure in large urban zones.

Let me remind everyone that industry warehouses do not have to be sited on flat ground. Sloping hills can serve as 2 story warehouses. If a big semi truck trailer can pull Hwy 84 over Mecham or I-5 over the Siskiyou's or Hwy 26 over Mt Hood, then they can pull a low ridge in the Burns, John Day, Prineville, Lakeview area that is contiguous to the urban growth boundary.

Our open space in all areas of the state are needed for Agr, Forestry, Sage Grouse, deer, elk and other nongame species. We just have more of it east of the Cascades.
