





Board Excellence

Board Meetings and Outreach

- Meets 6 times per year, including three 2 day meetings.
- Averages 2 travel board meetings per year to meet and talk with practitioners and members of the public outside the Salem/Portland area.
- Since 2014, the Board has traveled to Florence, Corvallis, Sunriver/Central Oregon, North Bend/Coos Bay, Baker City, and Ashland.
- 2019 schedule includes meetings in McMinnville and Klamath Falls.
- Board requires new licensees to attend an Introduction to the Board class put on twice per year.

Budget Requests

- POP 100 Reclass Director to Approved HR Class. \$36,680 Other Funds expenditure limitation increase to fund the DAS CHRO approved reclassification and compensation calculation for the Executive Director position, from PEM C to PEM D. Original request to DAS' Central Evaluation Team was made in July 2017 and was approved, retroactively, as of August 1, 2017. This was the first time a class and compensation analysis was done since 1990.
- POP 101 Implement Database Upgrades. \$40,000 Other Funds expenditure limitation increase to fund replacement or improvement of Microsoft Access licensing database that has been in use since 1993. An updated, more user friendly interface will increase staff efficiency in responding to public inquiries.
