Over the past seven years we have helped in the formation and growth of the Gorse Action Group (GAG). GAG consists of over 40 public and private sector partners who have an interest in controlling and eradicating gorse. In 2017, Oregon State Governor, Kate Brown, designated Gorse as an Oregon Solutions project. Through that process, a Declaration of Cooperation was signed by 25 public and private stakeholders in the region including The Oregon Department of Agriculture.
