

To the Senate Committee On Health Care,

I'm writing to ask your support for SB 452.

This bill Directs the Oregon Health Authority to develop triage, treatment and transportation protocols for patients who carry emergency use medications. Allows emergency medical services provider to administer to patient emergency use medication carried by patient.

My child has an emergency medication she carries at all times. In times of emergency my child needs this medication. It not only can save my child's life, but prevents further harm.

My daughter is 12 years old and has primary adrenal insufficiency (Addison's). Her activities are very limited because whoever is with her, has to be willing to be trained on her emergency solu cortef injection. If they are not willing, she can't go out with that person. If an emergency medical tech can administer this LIFE SAVING medication, it will allow her to be a more normal kid now and as she get older!
