I have lived here for 5+ years and enjoy the river ever summer. We follow the rules, signs, and clean up the river when we see non-natural debris.

It's a great place for all to enjoy. I hope people can have some tolerance and understand that boats are not destroying the riverfront property. Nature is in charge of that.

Don't buy waterfront property unless you can live with what comes along with the water. Its like moving next to a dump and then trying to make the dump move because they don't like being next to a dump.

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
