Modifies license fees for heating oil tank regulatory program.

#### Analysis:

This legislation corresponds to *Policy Option Package (POP)* 131- Maintain Heating Oil Tank (HOT) Program within the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) budget (HB 5017). The bill would increase existing fees that support the HOT Program which provides oversight and auditing of licensed contractors who clean up oil tanks. Fee revenue supports the personal service and associated services and supplies costs for four existing positions (4.00 FTE) including a Natural Resources Specialist 1, Natural Resource Specialist 3, and two Operations Specialists 2. It is assumed that the DEQ budget already has enough limitation to support these positions, therefore no additional expenditure limitation is necessary.

\*for purposes of this analysis, fee revenue for service provider licenses is assumed to not increase until January 1, 2022. DEQ may assess the increased fee amount prior to January 1, 2022 for license activities occurring on or after January 1, 2022.

The Legislative Fiscal Office notes that if the fee increase is not ratified into law, then the agency may need to hold one of the aforementioned positions vacant during the 2019-21 biennium due to lack of available funding.
