

## The direct relationship between textbook costs and student success:

65% do not purchase textbooks at some point due to cost

**35%** take fewer courses due to textbook cost

- Open license (usually Creative Commons) or Public Domain
- Free because of open license permissions
- Can be online or in print (at low cost)
- Variety of formats and content types
- Solves the root cause of the cost problem


