Regarding: SB 608: Concerns relating to residential tenancies

Dear Chair Keny-Guyer, Senator Knopp, Representative Helt, Representative Zika, and Members of the Committee,

The Bend Chamber of Commerce would like to provide additional input on SB 608. Bend, like many parts of Oregon, is in desperate need of additional affordable housing, and recognize the need for all citizens to have a home in our community. However, as stated in our letter dated February 11th, we continue to have concerns that SB 608 may inadvertently inhibit the addition of affordable housing inventory -which is essential to resolving our housing crisis.

We also want to emphasize that the rent increase cap must not drop below 7 percent, plus CPI. Any less than this, now or in the foreseeable future, could have the opposite affect the benefits this bill is intending to provide renters. Additionally, the legislative and public comment process for this bill has been so expedited that we are concerned there is not adequate data to understand its impacts. We also have concerns about the emergency clause making the rules effective upon passage. The pace with which this legislation is moving to implement unprecedented statewide rent control might create further disruption in an already unstable housing crisis.

On behalf of the Bend Chamber of Commerce, our 1,300+ members representing over 25,000, SB 608 needs to address the root cause of our housing crisis – supply – and the affects SB 608 will have on inventory and housing costs for our area over time.
