My name is Evelyn O'Toole and I am writing as a single, retired person on fixed income . I moved to Oregon from California because the living expenses there had become too outrageous. You seem to be trying to duplicate their excess here.

I am vehemently **opposed** to HB 2020 because if implemented it would put extreme hardship on all retired people living on a fixed income. We worked hard all our lives and find it punitive for you to burden us with additional taxes . As I understand it, the cap and trade law would raise % 550 million in new revenue for the government with no accountability for how lawmakers and government employees would spend the money. The law states that any revenue producing endeavor needs to have **public approval.** So why don't you have people vote on the issue???

I also fear that your measure will threaten the livelihood for Agricultural businesses, since they will not be able to recoup the increased prices of fuel. Tis, it will turn Oregon into an economic wasteland. State legislators have a **fiduciary duty and obligation** to treat citizens equally and not to benefit one group over the other.
