Hello,

I am writing to tell you that I oppose HB 3063, the bill to end all non-medical vaccine exemptions for Oregon schoolchildren.

I am a mother and an Oregon resident.

This is very important to me because **this bill takes away our medical freedom as Oregon residents** to choose what vaccinations we want our school age children to receive. I believe parents should **retain their rights and medical freedom** without being coerced.

It also takes away the freedom for everyone to receive education in our state regardless of philosophical or religious views. This is outright **DISCRIMINATORY** towards parents and children in the state of Oregon.

Oregon has only had 4 cases on confirmed measles this year, none of which have led to death. (https://multco.us/measles2019)

As of November 30, 2018, there have been more than $\underline{92,844}$ reports of measles vaccine reactions, hospitalizations, injuries and deaths following measles vaccinations made to the federal <u>Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System</u> (<u>VAERS</u>), including $\underline{457}$ related deaths, $\underline{6,902}$ hospitalizations, and $\underline{1,736}$ related disabilities. <u>Over 50%</u> of those adverse events occurred in children three years old and under.

As of January 2, 2019, there has been <u>1,258</u> claims filed in the federal <u>Vaccine Injury Compensation Program</u> (VICP) for injuries and deaths following MMR vaccination, including 82 deaths and 1,176 serious injuries. Only 2.7% of Oregon schoolchildren currently hold a philosophical or religious exemption, meaning that scientifically we already have high community immunity to disease. **Therefore, there's no reason to take away parental rights to those using non-medical exemptions.**

I hope you will not support this bill along with me.
