SB 387 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

Senate Committee On Health Care

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WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Allows medical marijuana processing site to transfer medical cannabinoid products, cannabinoid concentrates, or cannabinoid extracts to person designated to produce marijuana if the person designated to produce marijuana provides the processing site with the marijuana to be processed and the processing site does not receive compensation for transfer. Becomes operative January 1, 2020. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Oregon Medical Marijuana Program (OMMP) within the Public Health Division of the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) is responsible for the registration, regulation, and oversight of medical marijuana facilities in Oregon, including medical marijuana processing sites. Sites processing marijuana for the recreational marijuana system are subject to oversight by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission. Medical and marijuana businesses may not share the same physical address.

Senate Bill 387 allows medical marijuana processing sites to transfer certain medical marijuana products to individuals designated to produce medical marijuana.
