Against this bill.

I was pro-vax, I was raised by a family of medical providers. My uncle was the VP of Blue Cross Blue Shield, my nana and two aunts were nurses, my dad was a cardiac PA, health is a big issue.

Everything was by the book.

Until my son was vaccine injured at 4 months old. He spiked a 106 fever, and suffered a mild febrile seizure. He cried for days, his stool was loose, his skin was red, and our pediatrician did not find anything concerning.

We decided to make Oregon our home in 2011, since it provided us with peace of mind, health, and wellness for our family.

My son now cannot eat eggs (anaphylactic), and reacts to corn, cassava, and dairy. He now suffers from asthma, tachypnea, and severe eczema. He is double positive for the MTHFR+ mutation, which doesn't allow his body to process and detox normally. With any further vaccination his risk for type 1 diabetes increases, his risk for an autoimmune condition increases. His family and personal history points to an exemption. Yet there is no doctor who will write us a medical exemption.

I am very afraid not only the damage that could be inflicted on my son with continued vaccination, but also on other children that are the same or in worse position than my son, being FORCED to vaccinate.

The government should not be allowed to control parental rights for their children- for anything. But especially when a vaccine comes with severe, life long risk factors. And when the vaccine manufacturer cannot be held accountable.
