I'm writing as I will not be able to attend the public hearing in person, and I would like very much to express the importance of not passing this bill.

The most detrimental part of this bill is the effect it will have on the education of thousands of children in the state of Oregon, whether they have opted out of one vaccine or all. Regardless of any political views, that kind of disruption to education and constitutional rights for these children is just not warranted, justified or excusable. This would extend out to the 7.5% of Kindergartners who currently file for exemption in Oregon, half of which partially vaccinate.
