To whom it may concern,

I want to take the time to write you in hopes that you will vote NO on HB 3063. This bill is an infringement on our fundamental human right to bodily autonomy; it effectively alienates the inalienable rights of persons to make their own choices for their own families based on their moral and religious convictions. This bill is an infringement on my religious freedom as an American citizen, opposite to the very foundations our country was founded on.

Allowing this bill to pass would be setting a precedent for future liberties to be ripped away from our citizens.
