In regards to House Bill 3063...

As a mother of a 1 1/2 year old, and another on the way, I beg of you not to pass this bill. My husband is a doctor; we are not uneducated in the area of vaccinations. We are not anti vaccinations. We have chosen to utilize a delayed schedule of vaccinations for our boy. Additionally, my husband and his sister had nearly fatal reactions to the DTAP vaccination as infants. My husband was hospitalized, and almost died. For this reason, we have decided to wait to administer the first in the DTAP series for our son, just so that he is a little older and stronger, should he also have a reaction.

However, I do not have proof or documentation of this incident with my husband. If this bill were to pass, I would have been required to give my son the DTAP vaccination at 2 months of age. Can you confidently say that you are willing to take responsibility if something were to happen to him?
