To the Joint Commission on Carbon Reduction:

I am Stephen Bachhuber from Portland, Oregon. Please accept my testimony on behalf of the proposed cap and trade legislation.

I am 70 years old, old enough to see the effects of climate change in my yard, my garden, our forests, farms and snow pack. I worry about the earth that my grandchildren will inherit and how little time we have to act.
