


To the Oregon State Legislature

Hello. I would like to voice my concern over the changes House Bill 3063 will make to ORS 433.102, 433.267, 433.269, and 433.273. These changes, namely the removal of the language in section 2 part C allowing for personal and religious exemptions of vaccine requirements for school, are an infringement of my personal freedom and a violation of my rights and my children's rights.
