

Hello, my name is CarolAnn Liebelt from Saint Helens, Oregon. I have three healthy, unvaccinated children who would like to retain their access to a public education. Our family not only has a history of serious vaccine injuries, but we also have strong religious and ethical objections to vaccination. It wasn't until I had my own kids, that I took the time to read the ingredients of the vaccines. What I learned was very concerning to me. Several vaccines are cultured in cells obtained from 3-4 month gestation aborted fetuses. The use of fetal humans in the manufacturing process of any product goes against what I believe is moral.
