I oppose HB 3063.

As a child I was injured with the MMR vaccine - I developed rheumatoid arthritis which is one of the possible adverse reactions as stated in the vaccine insert. It was my rheumatologist that first educated my family on vaccine reactions - our family doctor had not done so. At that time there was a measles outbreak at my school and so my rheumatologist recommended and provided me with a medical exemption from the MMR booster. Unfortunately, I was already crippled.
