As a physician, I strongly oppose HB3063. Vaccines, like any other pharmaceutical products, can cause injury and death in some people and come with contraindications in others. The US Supreme Court recognizes vaccines to be "unavoidably unsafe" and to cause injury and death in some recipients. The US Government has paid out more than \$4 billion dollars to vaccine victims through the National Vaccine Injury Compensation program. One of the most basic human rights is that of bodily autonomy—voluntary consent of the is absolutely essential - as supported by the Nuremberg Code. When there is risk, there must be choice. Ethical medicine requires completely voluntary and fully informed consent, therefore I vehemently oppose mandatory vaccines (or punishment for opting out of one or any number of vaccines.)

Children today receive 69 doses of vaccines, more than double the schedule in 2000. The US vaccine market was \$36 billion in 2018, and expected to reach \$50 billion by 2023. Pharmaceutical research companies are developing more than 260 vaccines, and there appears to be no end in sight. **This is a very powerful industry with resources to lobby and influence policy to remove parental rights.** The industry benefits from forced use.

In Oregon, according to the OHA, 95.3% of students K-12 have been fully vaccinated and according to the CDC, there has been 159 cases of measles nationally. **This is no emergency**. But the data (most certainly underrepresented) from the Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System indicates that <u>93,179</u> reports of measles vaccine reactions (including hospitalizations and deaths) alone have been reported, as of November 2018. It seems very clear to me that we need to turn our eyes to vaccine safety and step far away from the concept of forced vaccinations.
