Please reconsider HB 3036. I am a mother of two children who have been on a very slow incremental vaccine schedule. Freedom to do this my way has been really important to me and my family. I have been cautious about not administering too many vaccines as I am also a practitioner who works with children and have seen vaccine reactions that have concerned me over the years. I am not anti-vaccine, yet I do believe in administering only the absolutely necessary vaccines and in a very different schedule then the mainstream model.

What I know from studying genetic models of methylation and detox for different patients, there are factors that make it more difficult for certain children to detox and deal with vaccines. Also kids who have autoimmune susceptibility are often triggered into active autoimmunity by vaccines (I have seen this in my practice as well). We need to be able to make Educated decisions that we feel are the best for our children. This is a fundamental right. This is not something that should be mandated by law or government. This is a choice that should remain in the hands of the parents and individuals.

I also think that barring children from attending public school because they're not completely up-to-date on their vaccines is an inappropriate and unfair punishment to those children.

I feel very strongly about this issue and strongly oppose HB 3063.
