I submit this testimony in support of HB 2897. My clients are very supportive of an improved early learning landscape in our state, recognizing the impact that quality preschool can have upon kindergarten readiness. It sets a solid foundation for students to build upon as they enter the primary grades. Increasing access for all students and families can help mitigate some of the learning gaps in our system.

The schools in East Multnomah County serve a diverse population of students and are committed to keeping equity front-and-center in their work. We see HB 2897 as an opportunity to address the current inequity that is the starting line from which students begin their journey through our K-12 system.
