Dear Oregon Legislators,

I vehemently oppose HB 3063, as I do not believe a child should be excluded from attending school in Oregon due to vaccine status, whether based on religious or philosophical reasons. Oregon has a very high vaccination rate currently, and non-vaccinated children can go "anywhere else" in our communities right now (i.e. Moda Center, shopping malls, grocery stores, etc), so why exclude them from educational environments of any kind?
