Dear Co-Chairs Dembrow and Power, and members of the Joint Committee on Carbon Reduction,

My name is Jamie Painter and I live in NE Portland. I ask that you please ignore any typos as I have a plucky toddler bouncing on me as I try and write this. I'm writing in support of HB 2020, the Clean Energy Jobs bills.

In full disclosure, I'm a former lobbyist and was proud to be able to work on this legislation in the past with an amazing and diverse coalition, but today I'm just writing to you as a mom. A mom who is absolutely terrified for the future and the climate catastrophe my young son could inherit.

I remember very vividly visiting Washington DC in 2007 to talk to our members of Congress about the threats of climate change, more severe and increased storms, more severe and longer wildfire seasons, and wildlife in crisis. We are seeing those impacts today-and Scientists agree we only have 11 years to drastically reduce emissions if we want to avoid the most catastrophic impacts of climate change.
