Over the past four years, I have had the privilege to travel and meet the leaders of the city gospel movement around the country. Humility Builds Trust



School Care gets the ball rolling

In **Seattle, Washington**, faith leaders built a coalition of community churches to do a simple day of service at Sanislo Elementary School. Because of this one day of service, a new trust is being built between the school and its church neighbors - and the children are being supported by church.

In **Detroit, Michigan**, Oak Pointe Church and Life Remodeled came together with neighbors and business leaders to do the largest school care project in the nation at Cody High School. 15,000 volunteers and \$5,000,000 of donations resulted in erasing years of neglect, inspiring new classrooms and labs, rejuvenating neighborhoods, and fully rebuilding the football field and track.

In **Portland, Oregon**, a "one-day" service project for Roosevelt High School has led to similar service projects all over the country. SouthLake has served there for nearly a decade and today Roosevelt is being completely renovated and re-built.

The schools are among the most hopeful places in the lives of our young neighbors, and in many cases - the only place where their needs are properly met. Illiteracy plagues their city - resulting in epidemic levels of poverty, incarceration, crime, addiction and more. By addressing early childhood reading levels, faith leaders are partnering with schools to close the academic achievement gap AND developing healthier productive citizens - ready to learn... and ready to earn.

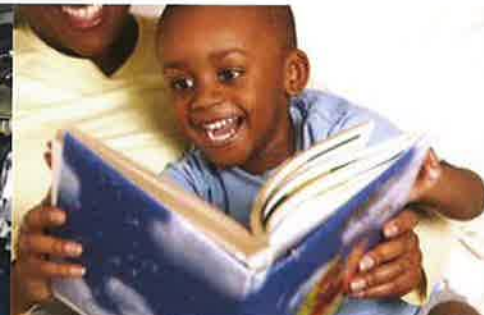
In **Sacramento, California**, churches and non-profits are working together with schools to address:

Care Leads to REAL Change



Faithful Advocacy leads to lasting results

Compassionate Service - School, Student and System Care - is essential, but in the end, we will not close the educational achievement gap with service projects alone. And if we want REAL change for our kids there is one more step. It's called Faithful Advocacy.

People of faith become powerful voices for REAL CHANGE. Many of the biggest transformations needed to close the achievement gap will only come with concrete changes to public policy - locally, statewide, and nationally.

We recognize that our nation has the resources, talent, and know-how to solve education inequality. Because we are involved, we become educated about the real needs, we seek concrete changes and we join forces letting leaders and policymakers know that these issues matter to us.

At Roosevelt, school and student care projects lead to an overall awareness of the issues confronting the kids. Before long, other non-profits and businesses joined forces to also create lasting change for the kids. Local churches and non-profits are now serving the Roosevelt feeder schools.

Ultimately, a Bond measure was passed and Roosevelt is now undergoing a \$90,000,000 remodel. Just 8 years ago, it was on the "slated-for-closure" list.
